



Guatemala - Antigua (*Tikal*) May 29th (Saturday) – June 5th (Saturday)

This mission is designed to bring medical/dental care to Mixco and other areas of Guatemala City, near the famed colonial city of Antigua. Guatemala is the largest and most populous of the Central American countries and one of the poorest. Over 56% of the population live in abject poverty (half earn less than \$2 a day). We will be providing three days of free clinic in one of the most impoverished areas of Guatemala.

Travel to Antigua (UNESCO World Heritage Site)

Antigua, may be the most outstanding and best-preserved colonial cities in Spanish America, having been founded in the early 16th century. The Spanish Colonial style permeates every part of the town: its houses, churches, squares, parks and ruins, and its traditions and folklore as well. Antigua is a city of charm and color where you can see and buy an overwhelming variety of attractive, handmade products that honor the traditions of generations of artisans.

We will stay at the *Casa Santo Domingo*: a five-star hotel that was built in the 16th century. Within its 400 year old walls there used to be a colossal monastery, but today it is a luxury hotel complex offering a memorable stay. The hotel's decor incorporates many works of art, and the architecture itself

is a magnificent example of 17th century art in Guatemala. Today – Tours of Ruins, museums (including the coffee museum), or Horseback riding in Guatemala countryside for those that so desire. Or Horseback riding up an active Volcano as an optional activity

***** Tikal -- For those who wish to travel to Tikal arrangements can be made for you to fly out of Guatemala City and return the same day. This can be done on Friday or Saturday. This is not part of the FDoA mission, but seeing Tikal is highly recommended.**

Tikal is a UNESCO Heritage of Humanity Site and is among the world's travel wonders, many calling Tikal one of the most spiritually powerful spots on earth. Its towering pyramids loom out of the thick jungle canopy like stoic sentinels of ancient mysteries. Tikal was once a wealthy metropolis of 100,000 inhabitants and the seat of power for the great Jaguar clan lords. Today, Tikal attracts archeologists from all around the globe and the jungle surrounding the ruins makes it a naturalist's dream.
